During the week from June 21st to June 27th, 2010, Queen Charlotte RCMP responded to 28 calls for service. Some of these are as follows:

- On June 21st, RCMP investigated a local youth for breach of a bail document. Charges are being forwarded
- On June 22nd, RCMP assisted the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure with the removal of a boat and trailer on Oceanview Dr in the area of Bearskin Bay.
- On June 22, RCMP received a call of a windsurfer potentially in need of assistance.
- On June 22nd, at 2330hrs, RCMP received a complaint of gunfire on Mountainview Way in Skidegate. Investigation revealed it was fireworks related to the Aboriginal Days celebrations
